



May is officially half over – Memorial day is close at hand, which means summer is almost here!








May 31 is our second Fritz’s run. I think I can say with confidence the weather should be a bit warmer than the first gathering in April. Hope to see you there.








Theresa introduced the current board members, all committee chairpersons and immediate past president Ron Hagenow. Members were reminded to sign the attendance sheet and purchase 50/50 tickets.

Treasurer's Report

Sara Gibson reported income and disbursements and a balance as of April 30th of \$3270.87. There was no discussion. A motion was made by Ron Hagenow to accept the report and it was seconded by Carl Ballinger. It was approved by the membership.

Secretary's Report

Peggy Craig made a motion to accept the minutes from the April 7, 2009 meeting as published in the newsletter. Jerry Fain seconded the motion. There was no discussion and it was approved by the membership.

Membership Report

Ruth Howard reported current membership of 81 regular members, 12 associate members. Ruth recognized members celebrating April birthday and anniversaries.

National Corvette Museum Ambassador's Report

Judy Dooley reported the museum is offering a special deal to people attending the 2009 National Corvette Caravan. They will offer special parking in front of the museum. The cost is a \$500 donation to the museum. The museum is looking for digital pictures to complete the new enthusiast's area entitled Living the Dream. You can submit pictures of yourselves, your Corvette(s), your family, your club to be displayed in a mural. When looking from a distance the mural will look like a 1953 Corvette but up close you will see it is actually made up of thousands of pictures. The categories are: People Make the Car, Corvette Lifestyle, and Corvette Racing. Judy's husband, Marty, went to the C5-C6 Bash at the museum in April and said the new expansion is absolutely beautiful. The drawing was held on April 25th for the 2009 red convertible. None of us won. Judy has tickets for a raffle to be held at the 15th anniversary celebration for a 2010 red convertible. Tickets are \$10 each.

National Council of Corvette Clubs Governor's Report

Rich Luebcke attended the governor's meeting on May 2nd. The Midwest region, of which we are a part, has the second most number of members in the country at 2,088. It has 32 clubs which is the highest of all the regions. It also has the most Future Corvette Owners Assn. members at 480. The Luebecke's grandson and the Walsh's grandson are both members of FCOA. The NCCC has 17,054 members nationwide and there are 984 events on the books. The 2011 NCCC national convention will be held in Tinley Park outside of Chicago. The Midwest region will play a big part in this convention. Rich passed around a brochure about Club Autobahn near Joliet, Illinois where on Monday of that convention they are offering lap time all day.

They will have high speed and low speed autocross as well. The plan is to have drag racing at Route 66 Dragway outside of Joliet. The 2009 convention will be held in Colorado Springs and the 2010 convention will be in Palm Beach, Florida.

There is \$38,764 available for scholarships offered by NCCC to children or grandchildren of members.

Application deadline is 5/9/09.

Dick Yanko, president of the NCCC and also a member of the board of the National Corvette Museum, spoke very positively about the NCCC presence at the museum. All of the clubs, including ours, will have an opportunity to be highlighted and showcased at the museum. Dick said more than 4600 people have signed up for the caravan so far.

Website Update

Jerry Craig said the website is up and running. He and Armynta will be out of town for the next three weeks so it will be quiet on the site for at least that time.

Sponsor Report

We have no sponsor as yet-the committee is working on it. Theresa Luebcke reported they do have an "in" with a Chevrolet dealer and Rich Luebcke is going to do a follow-up on it.

Theresa Luebcke presented two items. One was a thank you card from Dave Markland's family for the donation made by the club and the other was a letter from the Alzheimer's Association to whom the donation was made.

Prior Events

Theresa Luebcke talked about the C5-C6 Bash. There are a lot of changes at the museum.

In the Corvette Café there are tables with pictures of various cars on them. Pictures of the Luebckes' and the Dooleys' cars are there. The Café had wonderful food and service. If you've been to the museum, you've got to go back to see the changes.

It was so cold on the evening of the Fritz's run on April 19th that a lot of the participants piled into Judy Dooley's car to eat their frozen custard.

The cleanup and planting of the garden at Jefferson Barracks VA Spinal Cord Unit was a great success. All members gave a big round of applause to Bob Woods and Karen Price for the great job they did. Bob Woods said the garden looked phenomenal and breathtaking when the job was done. He feels it was the best we've done yet. All of the participants stood and were applauded. Karen Price thanked Jeff Craig who made several trips to Ellisville for free mulch so there was enough mulch to cover the entire garden. Thanks to Marty Dooley who painted the benches. Karen received a call from the medical director at the spinal cord unit who complimented us on the fabulous job we did and invited us to the wheelchair races on May 14th. If any members are able to attend, the director would like to recognize us on television for the great job we did. Jean Henderson put up a vegetable garden of tomatoes, peppers and herbs which got rave reviews from the patients. They are planning to use the vegetables in their cooking training. Karen said a lot of the flowers planted in the past have come back and the garden is the best it has ever looked. They have a person that comes in on Wednesdays to weed and water but Karen is looking for some volunteers to go check on the garden and water it on a regular basis. She has a youth group that will help as a service project. The patients were very excited that we went room to room to say hello and take them a plate of Lee's chicken. It made their day. Jeff Craig mentioned the library at the spinal cord unit at Jefferson Barracks could use updated books, novels, magazines, and movies on VHS. He took a box of Corvette magazines to them and the Fains donated boxes of books. Chris Woods said that she was told their VCR is in bad shape. Jeff Craig said he has VCR that has barely been used that he will give to them.


Dessert
