

Changing a driving lamp bulb

Try raising the headlamps and then turn back to park lamps, this will turn off the headlamps but leave them raised. Remove the hood stop on the side you are working on and this gives you a lot of room to fit your arm in and access the driving lamp bulbs. For fog lamps just push the brake duct to the side and reach up until you feel the lamp socket, twist and remove, if you have any problem find someone with smaller hands like wife/kid and recruit them to help.

Dear Fran:

I enjoyed our phone conversation last night and am looking forward to meeting you at this year's Bloomington Gold. Enclosed is information concerning the Gold Club Package we are offering to Corvette club members.

Corvette clubs that register and send payment before June 1st will be given reserved parking in the Gold Club area. Your club members will be able to park together, socialize, picnic, set up tents, and meet members from other clubs. With your registration, you will also be entitled to:

Express entry into the show.

- Freedom to exit the grounds and still have your parking reserved.
- Admittance to the GoldTour (40-mile Corvette parade).
- Commemorative GoldClub Pin for all drivers.

Your club will also be eligible for one of two awards. The club with the most cars in attendance and the club which travels the most miles to the show, point to point.

We have set up two options for clubs to reserve parking for their group:

- 1. Two-day plan: either Fri Sat or Sat Sun/\$60 per car
- 2. Three-day plan: Fri Sun/\$80 per car.

There is a five-car minimum to be eligible for either plan. Payments must be sent as a club, no individual registrations please.
